I. Paul and Silas- Acts 16:16-24

..."These men are servants of the Most High God, who are telling you the way to be saved."" Acts 16:17

- A. Paul & Silas use their greatest weapon. Acts 16:25
 - 1. In what seems to be their darkest moment they worship God!
 - 2. Can you imagine what this was like?
- B. We do not know what songs these Jesus freaks chose
 - 1. We know it happened and what it did for them
 - 2. A strong earth quake rattled the prison. Acts 16:26

II. The story of Jehoshaphat

- A. Worship is a powerful instrument in the hands of Jesus freaks
 - 1. The story of Jehoshaphat- 2 Chronicles 20:14-24
 - 2. The army of Israel advanced behind a choir!
- B. Not a typical battle strategy
 - 1. Songs of praise are a common response to victory or hardship through Scripture
 - a. Moses & his sister Miriam (after crossing the Red Sea)
 - b. King David (after defeating Israel's enemies)
 - c. King Solomon (As expressions of deep love)

III. God's mighty acts

- A. When we understand why we sing to God it becomes valuable to us
 - 1. Worship is a weapon God can use to break the chains that hold us.
 - 3. It can also free us from our prisons like we see with Paul & Silas.
 - 4. Jesus freaks sing!
- B. Freak ways to worship
 - 1. The Scripture encourages us to praise God always! Phil 4:4, 1 Thess. 5:16-22
 - 2. It is when we hit rocky times that worship becomes a weapon
